# 3rd Grade Curriculum

### **Bible**

Students are given an overview of the New Testament, with an emphasis on God's attributes, biblical characters, the early Church, and what it means to know Jesus Christ and live for Him. A Christian worldview is woven through each week's lesson in order for the students to make sense of life, how they view reality, and how to interact with the world. Scripture memory verses are embedded into each week's lesson.

#### Saxon Math

Saxon 4 includes mentally solving 0-12 math problems with addition, subtraction, and multiplication without any other counting device. Students learn to solve three and four step word problems, division problems, etc.

## **Language Arts**

The curriculum focuses on phonics-based spelling, expanding the students' vocabulary, cursive penmanship, grammar, and writing. Students read literature books such as Charlotte's Web.

## History

Students study the New Testament, Ancient Greece, and Ancient Rome. Students learn about the important people, dates, and events of the time.

## Geography

Curriculum is integrated with history and includes the teaching of various landforms in Europe and throughout the world. Students learn to recognize symbols of the United States.

#### Science

The science curriculum presents the universe as the direct creation of the God of Scripture and refutes the man-made ideas of evolution. It presents God as the Great Designer, Sustainer, and Lawgiver, without Whom the evident design and laws of nature would be inexplicable." The curriculum includes; Health, Safety, and Manners, Plants and Animals, God's Creation at work, Earth's Atmosphere, the Solar System, and the Human Body. The curriculum aids the student's knowledge of the world that God has made along with hands on activities to enhance learning.

#### Latin

The beginning Latin program teaches students approximately 100 Latin words. Students learn to translate between Latin and English, decline first declension nouns, conjugate first conjugation verbs in the present, imperfect, and future tenses, and learn prayers in Latin.

#### Art

Students discover the elements of art as they work on two dimensional and three-dimensional projects.

## **Physical Education**

The physical education program helps students develop their gross motor skills, learn game skills, and grow in their understanding of honoring God in athletic competition.
