K4 Curriculum

Bible

Students learn about the beginning of the world, God's plan for his family, Jesus' life and teaching, and God's helpers in the New Testament church. Students also memorize Scripture verses and learn worship songs. Art is incorporated into Bible activities.

Math

The Saxon K5 curriculum is used. It emphasizes number formation, number identification, and the beginning of addition.

Language Arts

The Abeka phonic program is used. It includes writing skills and reading. Emphasis is on the correct formation of letters and proper pronunciation of letter sounds.

Science

Students learn about light and dark, the five senses, plants, weather, animals, beach, ocean, and dental health.

Social Studies
